Agenda item 1. Agenda and meeting organization

Agenda item 1.1. Opening

1. Due to travel restrictions and guidance from health authorities, the Executive Board of the clean development mechanism (CDM) (hereinafter referred to as the Board) met virtually.
2. Mr. Olivier Kassi, Chair of the Board, opened the meeting and asserted that the quorum requirement was met.
3. The Board noted that Mr. Kazunari Kainou was unable to attend the meeting. He provided proper justification for his absence.
4. Table 1 below presents the attendance of members and alternate members at the meeting. The names of the members and alternate members present at the meeting are in bold print.

* In view of the postponement of the sixteenth session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP 16) to 2021, the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties, the CMP and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement, on 25 August 2020, decided to extend the current membership of the Convention, Kyoto Protocol and Paris Agreement bodies, as needed, until successors can be appointed or elected (<https://unfccc.int/news/bureau-confirms-criteria-to-advance-the-unfccc-process>). In accordance with rule 4 of the rules of procedure of the Board (decision 4/CMP.1, annex I), the members and alternate members shall remain in office until their successors are elected.

(a) Term: Two years, i.e. starting the first meeting in 2019.

- (b) Term: Two years, i.e. starting the first meeting in 2020.

¹ In accordance with the communication dated 12 December 2019 from the Chair of the Group of Latin America and Caribbean Countries (GRULAC), the member from Brazil (Mr. José Miguez) will serve the first year (2020) of the first term of office in this position, and the member from the Dominican Republic (Mr. Moises Alvarez) will serve the second year (2021) of the first term of office in this position. Further, in a communication dated 3 July 2020, the Chair of GRULAC informed that Mr. José Miguez will serve in office until 30 June 2021, when he will be succeeded by Mr. Moises Alvarez, who will serve for the remainder of the term.

Agenda item 1.2. Adoption of the agenda

5. The Board adopted the agenda of the meeting with the addition of the following items:
- (a) One request for registration of the programme of activities (PoA) "Latam Landfill PoA" (10531) under agenda item 3. 'Rulings';
 - (b) One communication (INQ-10760) under agenda item 5. 'Relations with forums and other stakeholders'.

Agenda item 2. Governance and management matters

Agenda item 2.1. Membership issues

6. The Board considered information provided by members and alternate members with respect to any potential conflict of interest.

Agenda item 2.2. Strategic planning and direction

7. The Board considered the concept note "Technical assessment of options with regard to the CDM registry in order to enable issuance of certified emission reductions with respect to emission reductions occurring after the end of the second commitment period for voluntary cancellation purposes" and could not find consensus on the matter. The Board agreed to reflect its discussion and the lack of outcome thereof in its annual report to the CMP.
8. The Board considered how to proceed with the survey to project participants on the status of their CDM activities, and agreed to conduct the next survey in 2022, after considering its scope and timing at the first meeting of the Board in 2022. The Board also agreed on the methods for conducting the survey in 2022.

Agenda item 2.3. Performance management

9. The Board agreed on the structure of its annual report to CMP 16 for the period from 15 December 2020 to 9 September 2021 and requested the secretariat to prepare a draft report for consideration by the Board at its 111th meeting.
10. The Board took note of the update on the status of the work of the Board, noting the changes in its workplan for 2021.
11. The Board took note of the first iteration of the designated operational entity (DOE) performance monitoring report for the fourteenth monitoring period from 1 May 2020 to 31 August 2020. The Board agreed to implement the actions specified in the "Procedure:

Performance monitoring of designated operational entities", version 04.0, for DOEs who are in the red and yellow zones based on the outcome of the second iteration of the DOE performance monitoring report for the fourteenth monitoring period. Further, the Board also requested the secretariat to publish the first and second iterations of the fourteenth performance monitoring period and the reports for the subsequent monitoring periods as per the timeline specified in this procedure.

Agenda item 2.4. Matters related to the Board and its support structure

12. The Board agreed to extend the term of service of the current members of the Afforestation and Reforestation Working Group (A/R WG), the Carbon Dioxide Capture and Storage Working Group (CCS WG), the CDM Accreditation Panel (CDM-AP) and the Methodologies Panel (MP), originally appointed by the Board at its 103rd meeting, to 31 December 2022.
13. The Board agreed to extend the term of service of the current experts for the CDM Registration and Issuance Team (RIT), originally appointed by the Board at its 103rd meeting, to 31 December 2022.

Agenda item 2.5. Operations of panels and working groups

(a). CDM Accreditation Panel

14. The Board took note of the report of the 88th meeting of the CDM-AP and its electronic consultation report. The reports summarized information relating to the work of the panel, including developments with respect to accreditation assessments and other accreditation-related issues. The decisions of the Board related to the recommendations of the CDM-AP are contained under agenda item 3.1. "Accreditation".

(b). Methodologies Panel

15. The Board took note of the report of the 84th meeting of the MP. The report summarized information relating to the work of the MP, including submissions of methodologies and recommendations to the Board. The decisions of the Board related to the recommendations of the MP are contained under agenda item 4. "Regulatory matters".

Agenda item 3. Rulings (case-specific)

Agenda item 3.1. Accreditation

16. The Board took note of the notifications by the CDM-AP on the successful completion of regular surveillance assessments of the following DOEs:
 - (a) E-0009 "Bureau Veritas India Pvt. Ltd." (BVI);
 - (b) E-0020 "GHD Limited" (GHD).
17. The Board took note of the notifications by the CDM-AP on the successful completion of performance assessments of the following DOEs:
 - (a) E-0016 "ERM Certification and Verification Services Limited" (ERM CVS);
 - (b) E-0069 "4K Earth Science Private Limited" (4KES).

18. The Board considered the recommendation by the CDM-AP regarding the performance assessment of the DOE E-0021 "AENOR INTERNACIONAL, S.A.U." (AENOR) and agreed to provide the DOE with another opportunity to close non-conformity E0021/VE8646/2020/04 by following the provisions in paragraphs 97–110 of the "CDM accreditation procedure" (version 15.0).
19. The Board considered the recommendations by the CDM-AP and, in accordance with paragraph 73(a) of the "CDM accreditation procedure" (version 15.0), agreed to extend the scopes of accreditation for the DOE E-0065 "China Building Material Test and Certification Group Co. Ltd." (CTC) in sectoral scopes 5, 11 and 16.

Agenda item 3.2. Registration

20. The Board noted that 7,854 CDM project activities have been registered as at 27 May 2021. The status of requests for registration of project activities can be viewed on the UNFCCC CDM website.¹
21. The Board noted that 349 PoAs have been registered as at 27 May 2021 and that under these PoAs, 2,735 component project activities have been included. The status of requests for registration of PoAs can be viewed on the UNFCCC CDM website.²
22. In accordance with the "CDM project cycle procedure for programmes of activities", the Board considered a request for registration of the PoA "Latam Landfill PoA" (PoA 10531), submitted by the DOE E-0066 "Earthood Services Private Limited" (Earthood), and decided to record the request as "provisional" and to be finalized by the Board after guidance from the CMP.

Agenda item 3.3. Issuance

23. The Board noted that 2,092,060,842 certified emission reductions (CERs) have been issued for CDM project activities and that 38,506,732 CERs have been issued for PoAs as at 27 May 2021. The status of CERs issued can be viewed on the UNFCCC CDM website.³
24. The Board noted that 76,829,488 CERs (CERs/tCERs/ICERs) have been voluntarily cancelled as at 27 May 2021. Out of these, 3,161,066 CERs were voluntarily cancelled using the online platform for voluntary cancellation of CERs. The status of CERs voluntarily cancelled can be viewed on the UNFCCC CDM website.⁴
25. In accordance with the "CDM project cycle procedure for programmes of activities", the Board considered a request for issuance of the PoA "Sichuan Rural Poor-Household Biogas Development Programme" (PoA 2898), submitted by the DOE E-0061 "Shenzhen CTI International Certification Co., Ltd" (CTI) for the monitoring period from 1 January 2019 to 31 December 2019 and decided to approve the request for issuance.

Agenda item 3.4. Other rulings

26. In accordance with the "CDM project cycle procedure for project activities", the Board considered a request for renewal of crediting period of the project activity "Huaneng Xinjiang Balikun Santanghu Second Wind Farm Phase I 49.5MW Project" (8550), submitted by the DOE E-0034 "China Environmental United Certification Center Co., Ltd." (CEC) and decided to record the request as "provisional" and to be finalized by the Board after guidance from the CMP.

27. In accordance with the “CDM project cycle procedure for programmes of activities”, the Board considered a request for renewal of PoA period of the PoA "Distribution of ONIL Stoves—Guatemala" (8480), submitted by the DOE E-0032 "LGAI Technological Center, S.A." (LGAI Tech. Center S.A.) and decided to approve the request for renewal of PoA period.
28. In accordance with the “CDM project cycle procedure for project activities”, the Board considered the following 10 requests for renewal of crediting period for project activities and agreed to continue its deliberations on these requests at a future meeting:
- (a) "Xundian Gaobenshan Wind Farm Project" (7427), submitted by the DOE E-0065 "China Building Material Test and Certification Group Co. Ltd." (CTC);
 - (b) "Guyuan Shandianhe Wind Farm Phase I Project" (8610), submitted by the DOE E-0046 "China Classification Society Certification Company" (CCSC);
 - (c) "Xinjiang Hami Southeast Wind Zone 2000MW Wind Farm Kushui First Wind Power Project" (8656), submitted by the DOE E-0065 "China Building Material Test and Certification Group Co. Ltd." (CTC);
 - (d) "Datang International Faku Shuangtaizi Wind Power Project" (9590), submitted by the DOE E-0061 "Shenzhen CTI International Certification Co., Ltd" (CTI);
 - (e) "Datang International Faku Wulongshan 48MW New Wind Power Project" (9736), submitted by the DOE E-0061 "Shenzhen CTI International Certification Co., Ltd" (CTI);
 - (f) "Henan Mianchi Shangqu Wind Power Project" (9828), submitted by the DOE E-0061 "Shenzhen CTI International Certification Co., Ltd" (CTI);
 - (g) "Jiangxi Datang International Jishan Wind Farm Project" (9857), submitted by the DOE E-0046 "China Classification Society Certification Company" (CCSC);
 - (h) "Jiangxi Datang International Songmen Mountain Wind Power Project" (9864), submitted by the DOE E-0046 "China Classification Society Certification Company" (CCSC);
 - (i) "Jiangxi Datang International Anyuan Jiulongshan Wind Power Project" (9877), submitted by the DOE E-0046 "China Classification Society Certification Company" (CCSC);
 - (j) "Chongli Xiqiaoliang Phase II 48MW Wind Power Project" (9897), submitted by the DOE E-0065 "China Building Material Test and Certification Group Co. Ltd." (CTC).

Agenda item 4. Regulatory matters

Agenda item 4.1. Standards/tools

(a). Standards for CDM project activities and programmes of activities

29. The Board considered the concept note "Impacts of the use of the digitized methodology ACM0002 on the regulatory framework", and requested the secretariat to analyze further the necessity of issuing a clarification to the existing regulatory documents including the "CDM project standard for project activities" and the "CDM validation and verification standard for project activities", and if found necessary, to present a draft clarification to the Board in time for the next major revision of the project standards, validation and verification standards and project cycle procedures planned this year in accordance with the "CDM Executive Board workplan 2021". The Board further agreed that such clarification, if needed, should be a general one so that it could also accommodate any additional methodologies included in the digitized tool.
30. The Board considered the draft revised "Glossary: CDM terms" that contained revised definition of "renewable biomass" and introduced definitions of new terms associated with market penetration of technology/measure, and requested the MP to analyze the existing approved methodologies and methodological tools with regard to the consistency in the use of these terms and related guidance, and to recommend revision to the methodologies and tools, as appropriate, based on the analysis. The Board requested the secretariat, in conjunction with these revisions, to propose a draft revised glossary containing revised definitions of these terms that are consistent with the methodologies and tools, for consideration by the Board at a future meeting.
31. The Board took note of the progress report on digitalization of methodologies for web-based generation of project design documents and monitoring templates.
32. The Board considered the concept note "Revision of project 256: Digitalization of CDM methodologies" and:
 - (a) Requested the secretariat to:
 - (i) Invite project participants on a voluntary basis to use the digitized tool in preparing the project design document (PDD) applying the methodology ACM0002 alongside the current manual pdf based PDD;
 - (ii) Undertake further road-testing of the web-based tool and report the outcomes using the PDD from recently registered activities and submissions received as indicated above;
 - (iii) Add the methodology "ACM0001: Flaring or use of landfill gas" to the web-based tool for automatic generation of PDDs;
 - (b) Instructed that the resources required for the above work should be absorbed within the existing CDM budget.
33. The Board adopted the revised "Standard: Sampling and surveys for CDM project activities and programmes of activities", as contained in [annex 1](#) to this report. The revision clarifies the requirements related to sample size calculation for the proportion parameter if the expected proportion is close to one.

34. The Board noted that there is a scope for further improving the editorial quality, clarity and consistency of draft methodologies, methodological tools and other methodological standards recommended for its consideration. The Board requested the secretariat to prepare a concept note proposing measures and options for addressing this issue, for consideration by the Board at a future meeting.

(b). Methodological standards for large-scale CDM project activities

(i). New methodologies and tools (large-scale)

35. The Board considered the proposed new methodology “AM00XX: Energy efficient water-grid-connected desalination plants”, and requested the MP to further work on the methodology to clarify the conditions under which the methodology is applicable taking into account the feedback provided by the Board at this meeting and recommend a revised draft of the methodology at a future meeting of the Board. In particular, the underlying assumption of the methodology that the project plant, especially the greenfield unit, will always displace the existing desalination capacity of the water-grid, needs further analysis in the context that the demand for potable water is growing in many regions.
36. The Board considered the recommendation of the MP to develop a tool for the water-grid emission factor and noted that the issue is closely linked to the progress of the methodology referred to in paragraph 35 above. The Board requested the MP to provide further information on the potential demand for such a tool, for example, the type of mitigation projects covered and the needs of the stakeholders in those areas.

(ii). Revisions to approved methodologies and tools (large-scale)

37. The Board approved, as major revisions, the following revised methodologies and tool:
- (a) “ACM0016: Mass rapid transit projects”, as contained in annex 2 to this report. The revision:
 - (i) Improves the consistency of the passenger survey requirements with the “Standard: Sampling and surveys for CDM project activities and programmes of activities” and the “Guideline: Sampling and surveys for CDM project activities and programmes of activities”; and
 - (ii) Clarifies the baseline scenario for possible expansion of the transport system using additional vehicles;
 - (b) “AM0031: Bus rapid transit projects”, as contained in annex 3 to this report. The revision improves the consistency of the passenger survey requirements with the “Standard: Sampling and surveys for CDM project activities and programmes of activities” and the “Guideline: Sampling and surveys for CDM project activities and programmes of activities”;
 - (c) “TOOL32: Positive lists of technologies”, as contained in annex 4 to this report. The revision extends the validity of the positive lists contained in the tool for one year, that is up to 28 November 2022.
38. The Board requested the MP to continue the work on the methodology “AM0027: Substitution of CO₂ from fossil or mineral origin by CO₂ from renewable sources in the

production of inorganic compounds”, taking into account the comments provided by the Board at this meeting, and recommend a revised draft for consideration by the Board at a future meeting.

39. The Board requested the MP to revise the methodological tool “TOOL06: Project emissions from flaring” to expand the scope of the tool to cover project emissions from hydrocarbons (non-renewable sources of methane), for consideration by the Board at a future meeting.

(iii). Clarifications (large-scale)

40. The Board approved the response by the MP to the request for clarification “CLA_TOOL_0044: Clarification regarding application of step 4 of the Common practice tool”, regarding TOOL24, version 03.1, as referred to in the report of the 84th meeting of the MP.

(c). Methodological standards for small-scale CDM project activities

(i). New methodologies and tools (small-scale)

41. The Board took note that no new small-scale methodologies and tools were to be considered at this meeting.

(ii). Revisions to approved methodologies and tools (small-scale)

42. The Board approved, as major revisions, the following revised methodologies to allow the use of biogas flow meters to demonstrate operationality of the biogas system and to reduce uncertainty in estimation of emission reductions:
- (a) “AMS-I.I.: Biogas/biomass thermal applications for households/small users”, as contained in annex 5 to this report;
 - (b) “AMS-I.E.: Switch from non-renewable biomass for thermal applications by the user”, as contained in annex 6 to this report;
 - (c) “AMS-III.R.: Methane recovery in agricultural activities at household/small farm level”, as contained in annex 7 to this report.
43. The Board requested the MP to revise the small-scale methodology “AMS-III.BA.: Recovery and recycling of materials from E-waste” to include consistent methods in determining the emission factors associated with the consumption of fossil fuel and consumption of electricity in the production of virgin plastics, for consideration by the Board at a future meeting.

(iii). Clarifications (small-scale)

44. The Board approved the response by the MP to the request for clarification “SSC_809: Clarification on eligibility of recycling facility under AMS-III.BA”, regarding AMS-III.BA., version 02.0, as referred to in the report of the 84th meeting of the MP.

Agenda item 4.2. Procedures

45. In response to a communication from a stakeholder (see paragraph 51 below), for the rejected requests for registration referred to in paragraph 11 of the EB 109 meeting report for which the project participants or the coordinating/managing entity wish to submit a new request for registration under the temporary measures referred to in the EB 108 meeting report, paragraph 7, the Board agreed to clarify that:
- (a) If there are any changes to the project participants, validating DOE, applied methodologies and/or standardized baselines, or project or programme design other than the revision of the PDD or PoA-DD and validation report to solely reflect the requirements on global warming potential values and a forward action request required under the temporary measures, the rules applicable to the cases where changes to project activity or programme occur after the publication of the PDD/PoA-DD (PCP-PA, section 4.3.2 or PCP-PoA, section 4.2.2) will apply to these cases *mutatis mutandis*;
 - (b) If there are no changes referred to in subparagraph (a) above except for the revision of the PDD or PoA-DD and validation report to solely reflect the requirements on global warming potential values and a forward action request required under the temporary measures, a new request for registration may be submitted without the republication of the PDD/PoA-DD for global stakeholder consultation;
 - (c) For project activities, to meet the requirement on prior consideration of the CDM referred to in the PCP-PA, version 02.0, paragraph 7, the notification submitted in lieu of the original request for registration or the publication of the original PDD for global stakeholder consultation may be used;
 - (d) For PoAs, to determine the start date referred to in the PCP-PoA, version 02.0, paragraph 6, the date of publication of the original PoA-DD or the start date specified in the notification submitted in lieu of the original request for registration may be deemed as the start date of the PoA.

Agenda item 4.3. Policy issues

46. The Board noted that there were no policy issues related to rulings at this meeting.

Agenda item 5. Relations with forums and other stakeholders

47. The Board took note of the external input received on the annotated agenda of its 110th meeting. The Board thanked the stakeholder for the input, which was considered by the Board under agenda item 4.1. 'Standards/tools'.
48. The Board interacted with the Global Designated National Authorities Forum (DNA Forum) co-chairs, Mr. David Hynes (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) and Mr. Kudakwashe Manyanga (Zimbabwe) via video conference, and took note of the Forum's inputs, among others appreciation of efforts made by the Regional Collaboration Centers in keeping the DNAs abreast of the latest development of the CDM and request for continued provision of updated information to DNAs on the centers' activities. The Board thanked the co-chairs for their inputs.

49. The Board interacted with the Chair of the DOE/Accredited Independent Entity Coordination Forum, Mr. Werner Betzenbichler, via video conference, and took note of the Forum's input. The Board thanked Mr. Betzenbichler for his input and encouraged the Forum to continue raising issues related to the Board's guidance and proposing solutions.
50. The Board took note of the following activities undertaken relating to stakeholders, DNAs, applicant entities and DOEs:
 - (a) 54th DOE conference call held on 1 April 2021 via video conference;
 - (b) Latin America and the Caribbean Climate Week 2021 virtual conference held from 11 to 14 May 2021.
51. The Board considered two communications (INQ-10737 and INQ-10760) submitted by stakeholders and agreed to respond to the submitters in accordance with the "Procedure: Direct communication with stakeholders".
52. No observers were registered for this meeting. Observers to the 111th meeting of the Board shall register with the secretariat by 9 August 2021. The proceedings of the open sessions of the meeting can be accessed via broadcast.⁵

Agenda item 6. Other matters

53. The Board agreed on the revised calendar of the meetings of the Board for 2021, as contained in [annex 8](#) to this report.
54. The Board agreed to the provisional agenda for the 111th meeting, to be held from 30 August to 9 September 2021, as contained in [annex 9](#) to this report.

Agenda item 7. Conclusion of the meeting

55. The Board agreed that any decisions taken by the Board at this meeting are deemed to have been taken in Bonn, Germany.
56. The Chair summarized the main conclusions and closed the meeting.
57. Any decisions taken by the Board shall be made publicly available in accordance with paragraph 17 of the "CDM modalities and procedures" and with rule 31 of the "Rules of procedure of the Executive Board of the clean development mechanism".
