LETTER OF APPROVAL

from the Interministerial Commission on Climate Change (hereinafter ICCC), in its capacity as Designated National Authority of Mexico to the Executive Board of the Clean Development Mechanism (hereinafter CDM) outlined in Article 12 of the Kyoto Protocol.

Programme of Activities Name: *Mexican Renewable Energy Alliance Programme of Activities (PoA)*

Programme Participants: Tonalli Renewable Energy Programme S. de R.L. de C.V. and Swiss Carbon Assets Ltd.

I hereby confirm that Mexico has ratified the Kyoto Protocol of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and voluntarily participates in the CDM. Therefore I declare that, having reviewed the documentation presented by the Participants, the ICCC, in its capacity as Designated National Authority, concludes that:

- i) Under the terms proposed, the implementation of the programme "*Mexican Renewable Energy Alliance Programme of Activities (PoA)*" proposed by Tonalli Renewable Energy Programme S. de R.L. de C.V. and Swiss Carbon Assets Ltd. will contribute to Mexico's sustainable development.
- ii) The parties involved in the programme do so voluntarily.

In view of the above, the ICCC issues this Letter of Approval exclusively for the purposes outlined in Article 12 of the Kyoto Protocol, as a requirement prior to the validation of the programme by the Designated Operational Entity, and for its registration before the Executive Board of the CDM and the subsequent issuance and commercialization of Certified Emissions Reductions by the Participants.

This Letter of Approval does not constitute an authorization to carry out any work or activities regulated by national legislation applicable to the three tiers of government.
