- (v) the State of the Netherlands hereby also authorizes the participation of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development as Trustee of the Prototype Carbon Fund (“PCF”) as a Project Participant in the **“CDM Project Activity”**;
- (vi) this Written Approval covers the requirements of paragraphs 33 and 40 (a) and (f) of the CDM Modalities and Procedures.

Finally, the State of the Netherlands declares that for the purchase of CERs resulting from the below stated "CDM Project Activities" and "CDM Programme of Activities", public funding of the State of the Netherlands is involved. It confirms that this public funding does not result in a diversion of official development assistance and is separate from and not counted towards the financial obligations of the State of the Netherlands in that respect.
