LETTER OF PROJECT APPROVAL

I hereby confirm that Mexico has ratified the Kyoto Protocol of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and voluntarily participates in the CDM. Therefore I declare that, having reviewed the documentation presented by the Project Participant, the ICCC, in its capacity as Designated National Authority, concludes that:

- i) Under the terms proposed, the implementation of the project “Quimobásicos HFC Recovery and Destruction Project (plant 2)”, proposed by Quimobásicos S.A. de C.V., will contribute to Mexico’s sustainable development.
