Pursuant to the rules of procedure of the Technology Executive Committee (TEC), as contained in annex II to decision 4/CP.17, I am pleased to notify Parties and observer States to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) that the 14th meeting of the TEC will take place from 28 to 31 March 2017 at the “Altes Abgeordnetenhaus” (AHH building) at the United Nations Campus in Bonn, Germany.
