INFORMATION NOTE

Online survey to identify mitigation impacts of climate change education and awareness-raising activities

The Conference of the Parties, by decision 15/CP.18, paragraph 8, requested the secretariat to promote partnerships with other organizations to support the implementation of the Doha work programme on Article 6 of the Convention.

In accordance with this decision, the secretariat is supporting a joint research project led by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization and the Centre for Environment Education India to assess and analyse the causality between climate change education and the reduction of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Observer organizations are invited to submit through the below online survey examples of programmes, projects or activities on climate change education or awareness-raising, which led or are expected to lead to GHG emission reductions.

The results of the survey will be considered as background information for the 3rd Dialogue on Article 6 of the Convention in June 2015, the intermediate review of the implementation of the Doha work programme in 2016 and a workshop on climate change education at the UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development in November 2014.
