

Progress of IFRC-co-led activities under TFD Plan of Action 2019-2021

Activity 6: (with ILO/IOM/UNHCR) Compile selected good practice case studies and lessons learned from relevant projects/programmes that have integrated climate-related mobility for the purpose of improving the design of project proposals and access to funding.

Update March 2020: IFRC, in partnership with Danish Red Cross and the University of Copenhagen, is in the process of compiling selected good practice case studies and lessons learned from relevant Red Cross and Red Crescent programmes in the Asia Pacific region, spanning preparedness, response, recovery and solutions to climate related mobility, particularly displacement. A draft of the case studies will be ready by end April, for finalisation in May 2020.

Activity 7: (with ILO/IOM/UNHCR) Raise awareness on integrating displacement in the context of climate change into national laws, policies and strategies, including on disaster response, building on mappings and lessons learned.

Update March 2020: IFRC has recently finalised a Fact Sheet on [Climate and Disaster Displacement: The Importance of Disaster Law and Policy](#). This Fact Sheet provides advice for national and local authorities, as well as relevant actors, on formulating disaster risk management laws and policies that effectively address human mobility, including displacement. The Fact Sheet is based on the new [IFRC Law and Disaster Preparedness and Response Checklist](#) and accompanying [IFRC Law and Disaster Preparedness and Response Multi Country Synthesis Report](#).

Activity 15: (PDD/UNHCR) Support Parties in strengthening their understanding of preparedness for displacement related to the adverse impacts of climate change, including early warning systems, contingency planning, evacuation planning and resilience-building strategies and plans, and support them in developing innovative approaches to preparedness, for example forecast- based financing.

Update March 2020: IFRC, in partnership with the Red Cross Red Crescent Climate Centre, and the University of Oxford, is in the process of developing a Policy Brief on Forecast Based Financing and Displacement. The Policy Brief will provide advice to national and local authorities on how to utilise Forecast based Financing as an innovative tool to avert, minimise and address displacement – focused on the preparedness phase. A draft of the Policy Brief will be ready by end April, for finalisation in May 2020.
